The Sheldon family story.

Glenn Sheldon came into prominence when he was elected President of the Club in 2004.

He set about reinvigorating the club. During his Presidency the SplashEye jump measuring system was installed, the Victorian Inter Club Tournament was refreshed, the Slalom League was introduced (complete with the trophy he donated to the club), the sunshades were organised and the boat ramp was refurbished. Glenn's Presidential legacy to the club is still evident today.

Glenn judged at tournaments throughout Australia. His highest honour was to be Chief Judge at the under 21 World Championships at the Isles of Hancock in Florida USA in 2013. Glenn worked hard to gain his National Slalom Rating. He joined the Victorian Team as a skier for the first time at the National Championships in Goondiwindi in 2018.

Glenn and Sherilynn's 3 sons James, Jack and Flynn are all talented skiers.

Flynn regularly gets into 13m in slalom and jumps over 35m

Jack regularly got into 12m in slalom and jumped over 35m

James regularly got into 11.25m in slalom, skied over 2000 in tricks (with a flip) and jumped over 45m. James was in the Australian Team for the Aussie Kiwi Challenge in 2010 (reserve in 2013) and the Junior World Championships in Italy in 2010. However his greatest success was winning the final of the under 21 Slalom National Championships in 2014 in Darwin after an exciting tie break with Tyce Zandler. James won the tie break by just a quarter of a buoy.
