Re: Application for Event Boating Activity Exemptions

I refer to the application received from the Geelong Water Ski Club (GWSC) for the 2025 \$4PB (Cash for Personal Best) Waterski Tournament to be held on the Barwon River between 6AM and 8PM on the 22nd and 23rd of February 2025.

I am pleased to inform you that the exemptions as stated in your application and Attachment 1 have been granted by Safe Transport Victoria.

As part of the application there is a requirement for GWSC to:

- publish the Declaration (Attachment 1) on the GWSC website/social media platforms and distribute the Declaration to participants.
- place signage of the Declaration on boards at access points/boat ramps at the event location.
- report an incident in relation to the exemptions should it occur, by way of notifying CCMA and Safe Transport Victoria (ST Vic) as soon as possible by email and completing an incident report sent to CCMA and ST Vic within seven (7) days.

PUBLIC NOTICE DECLARATION OF BOATING ACTIVITY EXEMPTION

Corangamite Catchment Management Authority as the declared waterway manager for the Barwon River between the Lower Breakwater and Orana Road, makes the following declaration under section 203(3) of the *Marine Safety Act 2010* (Vic).

For the purposes of boating activity conducted by Geelong Water Ski Club, persons and vessels involved in the 2025 \$4PB (Cash for Personal Best) Waterski Tournament are exempt from the following requirements:

State Rules made under the *Marine Act 1988*

1. Clause 2(a) – must not exceed 5 knots within 50 metres of a person in the water
2. Clause 2(c) – must not exceed 5 knots within 50 metres of another vessel
3. Clause 3(b) – must not exceed 5 knots within 50 metres of a fixed or floating structure

Marine Safety Regulations 2023

4. Regulation 66(3) – person must wear a lifejacket (of type specified) at all times when vessel is underway on inland waters
5. Regulation 69 – person being towed must wear a lifejacket
6. Regulation 70 – the master of vessel must ensure occupants wear a lifejacket and must not allow the vessel to be operated unless persons onboard when underway or being towed wear a lifejacket

Subject to the conditions detailed below:

- Masters of event official and rescue vessels are only exempt from items 1 to 3 when undertaking a rescue operation to retrieve persons in distress, provide for their initial medical or other needs and deliver them to a place of safety on shore, and must adhere to speed and distance rules at all other times.
- Masters of towing vessels are only exempt from items 1 to 3 for the duration of the event and item 6 when towing water skiers who are participating in trick events, and when retrieving waterskiers who are participating in trick events and exempt from wearing a lifejacket.
- ‘Trick’ skiers being towed are only exempt from items 4 & 5 provided they wear a bright coloured top.
- All persons on vessels and skiers associated with the event must wear a lifejacket (unless vessel over 4.8m or exempt from items 4 or 5 in accordance with these conditions), and vessels must have all prescribed safety equipment, including rescue vessels.
- Should vessels approach wishing to transit the event area they will be subject to the directions of the chief judge on the day and will do so to ensure that the safety of all waterway users is maintained.
- The exemptions apply from 6:00am to 8:00pm on Saturday 22 February 2025 and Sunday 23 February 2025 to persons and vessels involved in the 2025 \$4PB (Cash for Personal Best) Waterski Tournament within the event area – from downstream edge of Goat Island to approximately 900 metres downstream of the Geelong Water Ski Club.
- The exemptions apply provided the stated safety controls and undertakings detailed in the application form and associated documentation are adhered to.
